We focus on the "3- (+/-1) Pillars" for a sustainable system.

Session-1 Durable Individual "contact moments": Equip professionals with skills for enhancing interactions with clients in any domain. Examine how to use **Motivational Interviewing (MI)** to derive durable client outcomes.

Session-2 Resources coordination: Learn collaborative approaches for identifying, engaging, and coordinating care and resources clients need to navigate their world. Explore the use of **"warm handoffs"** to ensure clients utilize available resources more fully.

Session-3 Engage families in community: Learn to leverage family resources through the proven methods of **Family Groups, Teaming, and Conferencing**.

CURRICULLUM OUTLINE

Full-day Online Masterclasses on proven approaches and practice exercises to put to immediate use.

Day 1 – Core & Advance Skills for Engaging the Individual Client

Understand and learn proven "contact moment" skills evidence-based professionals must possess to work well with clients in their domain. Formal education for client-facing professionals in human, social and justice services fields. It teaches skills in the common elements of evidence-based approaches that practitioners must prioritize for helping clients they serve to acquire or strengthen their ability to perform critical life functions they may have "lost". These skills are essential in any life domain for helping recipients of services to incrementally improve versus "punishing" or "rehabilitating".

The common elements in EB approaches shift practice from diagnostic, problem, and clinically driven approaches to "partnering" as an advanced skill.

Day 2 – Practitioner Skills for Coordinating Care Services & Resources

Participants learn evidence-based case management practices and how they apply. They will learn to differentiate traditional ineffective deficit-centered practices from evidence-based and strength-centered practices. Using relevant examples, participants will learn how they can help their clients achieve desirable outcomes through promoting quality and effective interventions which link individuals to appropriate resources. Beyond linking to resources, they will learn to ensure the linking is complete and being utilized as intended.

Day 3 - Pathways for Family Engagement in Community

This masterclass focuses on **Family Group Decision-Making, Teaming and Conferencing** methods as the key frameworks that agencies can utilize to deliver durable family engagement services in their communities. They are evidence-based and strength-centered in how they build up families such that they themselves are positioned to find immediate solutions to needs and provide long-term solutions for issues related to their safety, permanence, and well-being. The approaches are evidence-based and strength-centered.

The research shows that use of evidence-based family engagement approaches provides enhanced collaboration, additional supports, and assessment information thus, improved outcomes.

Day 4 – (If scheduled) Leadership Development and Organizational Sustainability

NOTE: 4th session is designed for organizational leadership teams. It is scheduled occasionally.

Leaders will learn to lay the foundation for organizational success with the Evidence-Based Organization (EBO) framework for building and sustaining capable teams of evidence-based professionals. Well-intentioned initiatives often fail especially when faced with challenges due to the lack of an effective EBO framework.

Trevor is also a member of MINT (Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers). His work history includes over 15 years of experience in the human, social and justice fields including both inpatient and outpatient settings.

Trevor has a BS in Psychology with a minor in business management, an MSW degree, and a Ph.D. from the University of Kansas. A variety of populations have received training from Trevor including Community Mental Health Agencies, Assertive

Community Treatment Teams, Integrated Dual Disorder Treatment Teams, Child Welfare, School Districts, Private Schools, Peer Support Centers, Vocational Rehabilitation, College Counseling Centers, Regional Support Networks, State Attorney General’s Offices, Corrections Teams, Juvenile Justice, and Parenting Support Groups. Trevor has trained both in the United States and abroad.

Trevor has helped state agencies in their efforts to implement motivational interviewing system wide to assist in statewide cultural shifts towards more strengths-based strategies. To ensure fidelity to the intervention, Trevor has provided individualized coaching and feedback to counselors, social workers, supervisors, administrators, front line, and administrative staff. David L. Myers, PhD, is a Professor and Chairperson of the Criminal Justice Department at the University of New Haven. He previously was a Professor with the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), where he worked from 1998-2016. He earned his PhD in 1999 from the University of Maryland, Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice, and previously received a Master of Science in Administration of Justice and a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from Shippensburg University.

Dr. Myers has taught more than 35 different courses at the undergraduate, masters, and doctoral levels, specializing in classes on research methods and quantitative analysis, juvenile justice and delinquency, and criminal justice policy, planning, and evaluation. He has published 3 books (including *Becoming an Evidence-Based Organization: Demonstrating Leadership and Organizational Growth*, Joyfields Institute for Professional Development, 2013) and over 50 journal articles, book chapters, or other scholarly works. His scholarship has appeared in such journals as *Criminology and Public Policy*, *Crime & Delinquency*, *Youth Violence and Juvenile Justice*, and *Criminal Justice and Behavior*.

The Certified Evidence-Based Practitioner (CEBP) program is a structured curriculum of training and self-study followed with a half-day proctored exam. The process provides practitioners with a standard method to become Certified Evidence-Based Professionals.

In addition, it creates a progressive professional development vehicle and an outstanding opportunity for individuals to become highly knowledgeable and skilled in evidence-based approaches. Finally, it recognizes the abilities and accomplishments these professionals have demonstrated in the area of evidence-based policies, programs, and practices.

Certification in Evidence-Based Leadership (CEBL) program is a structured curriculum of training and self-study followed with a take-home implementation project which candidates must report back on. Designed for individuals who participate in the Evidence-Based Organization (EBO) Masterclass training, the process provides leadership and operations teams with a standard method to become Certified in Evidence-Based Leadership. Participation in the training also helps to fulfill an organization's initial training requirement for entering the process of Certification as an Evidence-Based Organization (EBO).

The Certification for Evidence-Based Organization (CEBO) process provides a standard method for systematically building capacity as an Evidence-Based Organization (CEBO) and recognizes the abilities and accomplishments organizations demonstrate in the area of evidence-based policies, programs, and practices. Certification requirements are the same for all types of agencies and organizations.

The following five areas are emphasized:

- Knowledge and use of evidence-based policies, programs, and practices
- Demonstrating effective leadership
- Organizational culture and assessment
- Strategic planning, performance measurement, and program evaluation
- Building capacity and sustainability
